

NATIONAL DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION ACT 2019 (SECTION 889)

Overview of NDAA section 889

The US NDAA (National Defense Authorization Act) section 889 went into effect on August 13, 2020. It puts heavy sanctions on video surveillance and telecommunications equipment or services produced or provided by entities (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities) covered in the section.

This section outlines the prohibited use of certain video surveillance, telecommunications services, equipment and components manufactured by specific vendors. For our partners and customers, these regulations can affect international supply chains, GSA contracts and even currently deployed technologies, especially if the customer is a U.S. government-related agency.
